Land Patents to Indians.

The following telegram from Washington appeared in the Oregonian last Saturday, March 3:

"The bills of Senator McBride and Representative Tongue to grant patents to such Indians of the Siletz reservation as are capable of governing their own affairs were referred to the Secretary of the Interior, and by him to the Indian Commissioner, who reported adversely on them, saying he does not believe in promiscuously granting patents to these Indians, but adds that no opposition will be made to granting patents for the lands of deceased Indians. Accordingly, Representative Tongue has offered an amendment providing that when any Indian on the reservation over 21 years of age becomes the owner of more than 80 acres, the Secretary shall patent all over that amount, reserving the best land for the Indian."

The Oregonian says a man working in the logging camps of Oregon "can clear several hundred dollars working eight of the pleasant months of the year, and if he desires can spend the rainy season in Portland and live very comfortably." He would do much better to work at least ten of "the pleasant months of the year" and then spend the "rainy season" on Yaquina bay. When the beginning of "the pleasant months" rolled around again, instead of being the victim of too much Portland, he would find but a small hole in his wages. It is almost criminal to urge workingmen to spend their idle season in the wicked city.
