Feeding for Eggs.

We well know that in all branches of business there are those who take advantage of opportunities and get the benefit of a raise in price. We can well afford to incur the expense of \$2 in place of \$1 where the chances for profit are twice as great. There are poultrymen who buy feed at good prices to feed when eggs are high in price and it pays them well. Just here I will say to those who complain of receiving no eggs to change the food by giving a goodly supply of meat once a day. A pound will supply twelve fowls, and if kept warm they will nearly always lay under a meat diet. A good plan is to chop a pound of meat and add to it a quart of beans after they have been well boiled and thicken the mass with ground oats until it
