In one of its chestnutty spasms, the Corvallis Times breaks open as follows:

Four years ago, when Tongue overthrew Herman, there was drive and thrift at Yaquina. Steamers were running regularly and loaded railroad trains ran to and from the valley. Now, after four years of Tongue, all is stagnation and paralysis. There are no loaded trains, no steamers, and wharves are rotting where they stand.

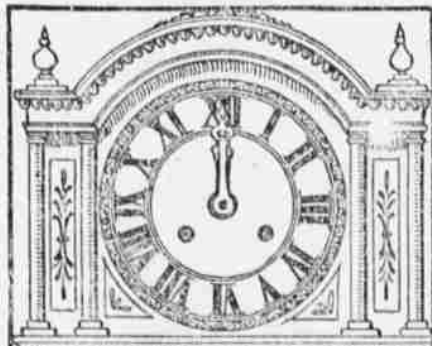
Oh, Doctor!

The Lakeview Examiner, published at the home of Dr. Daly, fusion nominee for congress in this district, comments as follows:

Really, the candidacy of Dr. Daly, fusion nominee for congress in the First district, now that the flutter of momentary surprise has vanished, is looked upon more as a huge joke than anything else. The populists can console themselves that they have nominated a banker and landlord as their candidate for congress, but how they can explain their position after all these years of denunciation of the "money power," "corporate wealth," "banks" and "money lenders," we are at a loss to know. Probably it was a mistake on their part; they may have been misled. It is the general opinion that the nomination of Dr. Daly on the fusion ticket was a mistake—it is thought to be here where he is known, at least. Dr. Daly is formidable only in his weakness in this campaign, and Lake county will surely show to the state how unpopular the doctor is at home as a congressional candidate.

Congressman Tongue does not consider it necessary for him to participate in the present campaign, and he is right. The voters of this congressional district are, as a rule, familiar with his record in congress. They know that he has been earnest and active, and they know that his failure to obtain favorable action on any measure in the interest of the state or district has been the result of opposition and obstacles which could not be overcome. They know that during his brief congressional career he has attained positions on committees reached by no other representative of the state in a similar period of service. The opposition may continue to make the charge of dishonesty and set up the chestnutty cry of "Traitor!" but they can furnish no proof. It is simply the old partisan wail, echoed by a few republicans with imaginary grievances. But many members of the opposition parties will stand by Mr. Tongue in the coming election, for they know that no new member of congress, especially a member of the minority party, can have sufficient influence to make his services worth his salary. Mr. Tongue has won his way to influential positions, and the people of this district are willing to trust their interests with him for another term.

Even the populist farmers are not now "looking for prosperity," but for some one to do their work. There were several in town this week inquiring for help, but failed to find anyone not already employed.—Casey (Iowa) Vindicator.
