The Oregon election has proven that a major per cent of our people endorse the policy of the administration. The majority of Congressman Tongue is to many a gratifying surprise. He had considerable violent opposition on account of local issues, but his position on the financial question and in regard to our island possessions was well known, and many a voter endorsed him on those issues. On the other hand, Bernard Daly was anything and everything—according to locality, etc. In some places it was whispered that he stood firmly on the Chicago platform and was against the administration on every proposition. At other points he was regarded as a gold democrat and an expansionist. Daly himself told where he stood in the following immortal words: "A candidate for office must be careful what he says."
