### ELK CITY ITEMS.

Sea trout have arrived.

H. Terwilliger of Portland is here among the trout for a month or two.

An army of worms are taking the liberty to eat up our gardens, and it seems impossible to stop them.

It seems from Monday's Oregonian the people who are interested in the fish business in this state are at this late hour becoming aware of the fact that something must be done or the state of Oregon is going to lose an industry that pays the state \$3,000,000 a year. We also find the Columbia river isn't the only place salmon can be caught. Yaquina bay last fall cut quite a figure in the Portland and Astoria fish business. Now it seems to me the time has come to move for the protection of the industry. Nothing can be done until the next session of the state legislature in the way of laws to protect the fish. We have this much known to be a fact: When two or three canneries were running on this bay the supply of fish was cut down to less than half, and chinook were taken out until it didn't pay to put up nets to fish for them. Traps and set nets were used at that time without regard to future supply. The bay was full of 45-mesh nets 100 fathoms long, and as soon as the fish were past Mill 4 and Toledo those nets were moved to the upper river or bay between Mill creek and head of tide. It was no uncommon thing to find from 75 to 125 sets from bank to bank and fastened to the bottom with rocks, making it most impossible for a salmon to get to Elk City. Since that day, and with an open channel and the use of only gill-nets, the supply has been on the increase. It is now our opinion if this and all other streams on the coast could be restricted to the gill-net alone and the traps and wheels cut out entirely, then put in hatcheries on all the streams, make the fishermen pay for the support of them, and the dealers must and will pay the first man. As a matter of fact, one-fourth of the fishermen on Yaquina bay last fall had no license to fish. This is not just or honest. Our fish and game warden should see that every man who fishes pays the bill, and then the fishermen should see that this money is placed to the interest of the district in the propagation of salmon.
