Novelty in Millinery.
A new adornment is finding favor among milliners. This consists of skeleton leaves preserved exactly as they fall from the tree and retaining their natural color. The leaves of the walnut, chestnut and platane trees are preferred for the purpose; large ivy leaves and oak leaves are also used. The longest leaves are formed into a large paillette, one side being composed of a stiff painted feather, the other of the skeleton leaf, thus forming a broad garniture. A fine invisible wire fixed to the edge of the leaf prevents its crumpling. The smaller leaves are made into garlands mounted on an artificial or natural branch. The leaves have to be perfectly preserved as their beauty naturally lies in the delicacy and transparency of the fiber.—St. Louis Republic.

Pickled Peppers.

Cut out the stem of the peppers in a circle, remove the seeds and wash out in cold water; then fill each with a mixture of finely-chopped cabbage, horseradish, mustard seed, tiny cucumbers, button onions and nasturtiums. Replace the pieces cut from the top and sew around with coarse thread. Place in stone jars and cover with cold vinegar.

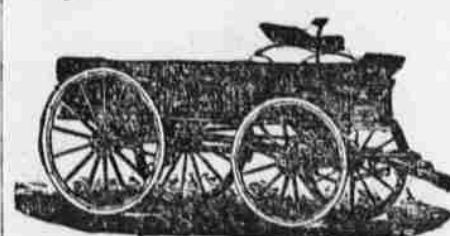

THE YOUNGEST DEER HUNTER.

California. Has a Six-Year-Old Slayer of Wild Game.

There is a six-year old slayer of wild game in California. His name is Austin Otis, and he can bring down a deer with as clean and pretty a shot as any veteran hunter in the country. His home is in the wooded hills, about fifteen miles back of Cazadero. He has lived among these hills all his life. Until the other day Austin had bagged no game larger than rabbits and squirrels. Now, however, he is the most talked-of youngster in the country, for around Cazadero are some of the finest shots in all the state. Having been refused permission to join a hunting party with his father, he shouldered his gun and started by himself down the creek. He tells of his adventure this way:

"I was wishing awful hard that I could see a deer," he said, "when all of a sudden, after I had gone about 500 yards along the creek, what should I see but a beauty of a deer with its nose to the stream, taking a drink. I had followed the creek on purpose, 'cause I knew that deer always come down toward night to drink, but I could hardly believe that my wish had come true so quick. I stopped short and looked at him. I thought sure he would jump into the brush before I could take aim, but he

didn't seem to hear me. Pup, my dog, understood just the same as if he was a man, instead of a dog, and stood perfectly still, except that he wagged his tail. I guess Pup was as excited as I was, but he had sense and didn't spoil things by barking. I lifted my rifle, but my hand and arm shook and I couldn't seem to see straight at all. I was pretty much scared that the deer would get away, so I lifted the gun again and took good aim. I remembered what papa always said about holding the sight on the point of the deer's shoulder. Then I fired. The deer gave an awful big leap up in the air, then ran. I guess he ran about forty jumps down the creek. My, you ought to have seen Pup run after him! I didn't know I had shot him until Pup caught up with him and he dropped. I ran as fast as ever I could, and when I saw he was dead I cut his throat, 'cause that's the way all hunters do. I like deer-hunting. A fellow doesn't want to kill quail and rabbits and bluejays and gophers and chipmunks all the time. If you're deer-hunting you ought to shoot through the heart. It brings the game down quicker and it doesn't hurt so much. That's what papa says, and he knows."

Death Rate in Battle.

Of the fifteen decisive battles of the world, the average death rate in the last five of them (of which alone reliable statistics are preserved), was about 25 per cent, ranging from 20 per cent, the British loss at Saratoga, to 47 per cent, the loss of the Swedes at Pultowa. Of other great battles it is difficult to fix the average death rate, though it may be estimated at about 20 per cent. The rates range from 0.9 (the German loss at Sedan in September, 1870), to 50 per cent, the British loss at bloody Albuera. As a matter of fact, things stand very much as they used to do, save that the slaughter, when it does occur, always comes more quickly. A great battle in which the quick-firing guns can be brought into effective use will probably increase the death rate largely, but that remains to be proved. General statistics prove that since the Trojan war, 3,000 years ago, not a single year has elapsed in which some war has not caused the killing of a large number of men, while it is calculated that all the world's wars are responsible for the deaths of 14,000,000,000 of human beings.—Boston Traveler.

New York Doesn't Furnish Speakers.

There has not been a New York speaker in the House of Representatives for seventy-five years. The last New York member to hold that office was John Taylor, who served from 1825 to 1827. There have been Democratic speakers from other States since the close of the war—Indiana, Pennsylvania, Kentucky and Georgia.—Kansas City Journal.
