Both Lord Roberts in India and Africa and Kitchener in the Soudan (when he had all the liquor brought into camp poured out into the desert sand) discovered that the soldier is better without strong drink. In time our military commanders will find out the same fact, especially in the tropics. Any kind of spirituous liquor there makes the climatic effects much more deadly. The "good beer" of the canteen has the results on many a temperament of exciting a craving for what is stronger. It is therefore safest entirely let alone, and warm drinks in winter, with fruit ones in summer, provided for our soldier boys.

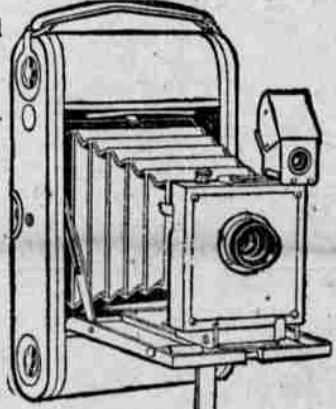
