The second annual report of the Oregon Historical Society has been received. It is a pamphlet 6¼x9¼ inches and contains 124 pages. It shows that the society had 627 members on Nov. 30, 1900, distributed in twenty-three counties in Oregon and four in Washington. The material collected during the year is classified as follows: Library Department—Documents, 134; diaries, account books, etc., 18; maps and charts, 15; bound newspaper files, 27; miscellaneous papers, unbound, 53; pamphlets, 165; miscellaneous books, 106; early school books, 48. Museum Department—Pioneer relics, 207; archaeological relics, 172; pioneer photograph, 448; other pictures, 139. The documents consist mainly of letters and other written matter relating to the early social and business life of the country, and the relics are such as were used while crossing the plains with teams or in the early industries of the country. Visitors at the rooms in the city hall, Portland, average 1500 a month, and all who visit that city are cordially invited to call.
