THROWS DOWN THE BARS.

That veteran autocrat of Colorado eastbound tourist rates who last year put the rates in effect on his road over the veto of other lines, John Sebastian, general passenger agent of the Rock Island, has again taken the initiative. The introduction of eastbound excursion rates last year in connection with the westbound summer rates which have been in effect for years, proved profitable to the roads and was very gratifying to the people of Colorado, thousands of whom took advantage of the opportunity to visit their old homes or friends at the east.

Mr. Sebastian has given notice of the intention of the Rock Island to make the rates, independently, if necessary, but announcing the rates and dates on which the excursions will be run. The aggressiveness of the Rock Island last year was appreciated by the Colorado public and at the close of the season had the hearty support of lines which had accepted the inevitable under protest. The notice sent out yesterday follows:

This company has submitted a proposition to the Western Passenger Association and Southwestern Passenger Association for excursions to and from Colorado points as follows: Westbound every Tuesday, June 18 to September 10 inclusive, rate of one fare plus \$2 for the round trip, excepting that on July 2 and 9, September 3 and 10, rate from Chicago will be \$25 and from Missouri River \$15 for round trip. Intermediate territory to carry proportionate rates. Tickets to be sold from Missouri River one fare to and from Glenwood Springs, Salt Lake and Ogden. Eastbound rate, one fare plus \$2 to all points, minimum \$6, every Thursday, June 20 to September 12, inclusive, limit of all tickets, October 31. These rates will be tendered connecting lines for basing purposes and will be made effective by this company if negative votes are cast. Special trains will be run on schedule of one night to and from Colorado on these dates by our line, carrying dining cars and complete first-class equipment."—Denver Times.

Horner of the Oregon Agricultural college writes THE LEADER as follows: "It affords me pleasure to report to you that I have succeeded in securing the services of Professor Rigler, city superintendent of the Portland schools, to take the principalship of the Summer Normal school at Newport this season. He will be assisted by Professor Burnham, who has a national reputation for proficiency in Geography and number work. Professor Rigley is a classical scholar and a graduate of a Pennsylvania Normal school, where he has high standing. He has 3000 children under his supervision all the while and is eminently qualified to take charge of this work at Newport. It is probable that the Normal department will begin about the 16th of July and continue a month, while the Seaside Lecture Course of ten evenings will begin on or about the 2d of August. People who stand first in their profession will take hold of the round tables—painting, music, amateur photography, etc. The seaside attractions will simply be great if the people will take hold; and we must send every person home with a great smile on his face with the anticipation of returning early next season.
