Rhododendron Excursion.

The beautiful weather we are now having is productive of spring fever, and our people, watching the swelling buds, many of which have burst into blossoms and leaves, are asking when the most beautiful of Oregon's wild flowers, the rhododendron, will bloom again. To get this information we were obliged to call at the Corvallis & Eastern railroad office. Rhododendrons attain perfection at Newport and Nye Creek between the 10th and 20th of May, depending on the weather. Usually the C. & E. run a Sunday excursion which inaugurates the seaside season at the coast. Mr. Stone, manager of the C. & E. informs us that one day excursions to the Bay will be generally discontinued this year, but that on Saturday, May 11th, or a week later, May 18th, owing to the advancement of the flowers, the company will make a low rate, good for Saturday, Sunday and Monday. This will give passengers all of Sunday on the beach or gathering all they can carry of nature's most beautiful flowers, which nowhere flourish as at Yaquina bay.
