What It Will Cost.

One beauty of the Seaside Normal School and Lecture Course is the feature of economy. The matriculation fees have been made very reasonable, as compared with the same grade of instruction in other states; the railway companies will offer reduced rates; hotels will grant concessions to our people; and private families will furnish board and rooms at rates same as charged by interior towns. However, tenting, which is much cheaper, will be one of the principal attractions to the seaside. Accordingly arrangements are being made to accommodate colonies, if necessary, with choice tenting grounds, where there will be no expense save the small fee paid the ground manager for keeping the camping premises neat and in order.

Preparations have been made to enable ladies desiring to tent by themselves to have the protection of the home. Also by writing in time to Mr. Samuel G. Irvin, mayor of Newport, tents, poles, stakes, shelves, and tables may be rented; and a man to put tents in order may be secured. Orders for groceries, vegetables, meats, wood and other necessities may be taken at the tents, thus affording the convenience of metropolitan life to those who desire to live cheaply in camp.

Rhododendron Excursion.

The beautiful weather we are now having is productive of spring fever, and our people, watching the swelling buds, many of which have burst into blossoms and leaves, are asking when the most beautiful of Oregon's wild flowers, the rhododendron, will bloom again. To get this information we were obliged to call at the Corvallis & Eastern railroad office. Rhododendrons attain perfection at Newport and Nye Creek between the 10th and 20th of May, depending on the weather. Usually the C. & E. run a Sunday excursion which inaugurates the seaside season at the coast. Mr. Stone, manager of the C. & E. informs us that one day excursions to the Bay will be generally discontinued this year, but that on Saturday, May 11th, or a week later, May 18th, owing to the advancement of the flowers, the company will make a low rate, good for Saturday, Sunday and Monday. This will give passengers all of Sunday on the beach or gathering all they can carry of nature's most beautiful flowers, which nowhere flourish as at Yaquina bay.

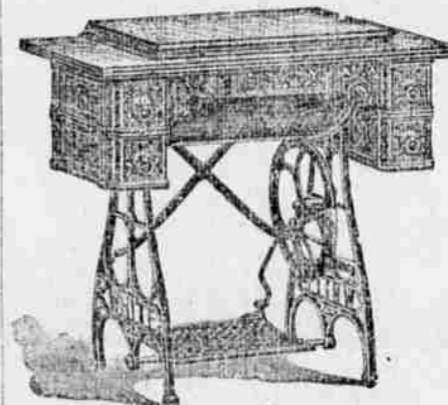
