AS OTHERS SEE US.

The writer took a little trip over to Toledo, Oregon, and made a few observations. While going up one of the little valleys the gentleman accompanying me, in passing a farm, said that five years ago the farm was purchased for \$1200, the purchaser paying \$200 down and giving his note secured by mortgage for the balance. The purchaser got some cows, a few pens of Black Leghorn chickens and went to work. Every Saturday he goes to Toledo, where he disposes of his butter and eggs—and his egg basket is full of nice, fresh, clean eggs. The mortgage is now paid off and the proprietor is the happy possessor of a good farm which he can call his own.

These valleys are very rich and there are many of them in Lincoln county. One party said he sowed an acre of clover in the spring and cut two tons of hay that fall. He claims that by actual test the sugar beets raised in that county are richer in sugar than those raised in Eastern Oregon. He claims that the tide land when dyked is rich enough to raise almost anything. This county is rapidly developing and is destined to be one of the richest in the state, especially will this be true when the dairy and the timber industries are fully developed. There are many orchards, most of them being small, but the trees look healthy and seem to be less subject to disease than in some other parts of the state.—Pacific Homestead.

OBITUARY.

William O. Margison was born September 27, 1865, in Cairo, Green county, N. Y., where two of his brothers are still living; he also has a sister at Catskill, N. Y. Losing his parents early in childhood, Mr. Margison was early thrown upon his own resources. He remained near his birthplace until he was 18 years old, when he went to California. March 31, 1886, he was married to Miss Mattie Wilhoit.
