HERMANN WINS!

Lincoln County's Choice Lands The Congressional Nomination at Eugene.

Early this morning THE LEADER received the following message from T. C. Jackson, Chairman of the Lincoln county delegation in the Republican congressional convention at Eugene: "Hermann wins on 24th ballot with 95 votes."

The news will cause general rejoicing in Lincoln county, regardless of party lines. Binger Hermann's record is too well known to require any further publicity. He will receive the biggest majority ever accorded any candidate for any office in Lincoln county—not less than 500, and probably more.

His splendid victory in the convention emphasizes his popularity throughout the district. Never before were there so many strong and able aspirants for the honor. Gatch, Kelley, Vawter, Brownell and Eddy are all exceptionally good congressional timber, and the nomination of either would have caused no great disappointment, but Mr. Hermann has long been regarded as the favorite, and the decisive manner in which he has won out is extremely gratifying to his thousands of warm friends and admirers.

Just watch Lincoln county on election day.

President Roosevelt's trail toward the setting sun is marked by a blaze of glory. It is very evident that he is nearer to the people than any president of modern times—the lamented McKinley not excepted—and it is a safe guess that the attempt of a few politicians whom he has offended to prevent his nomination next year will fall flat. President Roosevelt will reach Oregon

May 21 and Portland the following day. He will receive a genuine Web-foot greeting—possibly with rain on the side.
