The Yaquina Bay Newsance, with its customary disregard for truth and decency, tries to make its 11 readers believe that many of the Republicans of Toledo precinct were disloyal to Binger Hermann. The insult is hardly worthy of notice, but as Matthews is overlooked like a blade of grass save when he says something mean, we refer to the matter purely in a spirit of philanthropy. As all sensible men in the community know, not only the Republican vote of Toledo precinct, but the Democratic and Socialist votes as well, were considerably less than one year ago. The average Republican vote on state officers last year in Toledo precinct was 104; Hermann's vote June 1 was 94—only 10 less. The average Democratic vote on state officers was about 42, and the average Socialist vote 55. In the recent election Reames (dem.) got 45 votes and Ingle (soc.) 38. Here was a gain of 3 Democratic votes and a loss of 17 Socialist. It is known that at least 3 Democratic votes were polled by residents of Newport precinct. A number of Toledo Republicans were unavoidably absent on election day and cast their votes in some other precinct or county. In this connection it may do no harm to mention the fact that Toledo gave Hermann a larger vote than it gave Tongue; and also that Newport gave Weatherford (dem.) a majority over Tongue. Why didn't Matthews bellyache a little over the latter calamity? Oh, but Republicans do enjoy being criticised by a man who has for years been a barnacle on the party!

The blessed east has opened up unusually promising this season. Not in years—perhaps never before—have the cyclones, tornadoes and floods found so many victims before August 1. Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, Missouri and other "peerless" states have craped on their doors and large lists of property losses. "Oregon, sweet Oregon!" is still wide open and bids the afflicted easterners a hearty welcome.

In Honolulu.

The Honolulu Advertiser of May 24 has an interesting account of the arrival of the battleship Wisconsin, the first large warship to reach the naval docks at that port. Shield Rosebrook, who is a musician on the Wisconsin, has sent a copy of the Advertiser to his father, Austin Rosebrook of this city.

A few extracts from the article are appended:

The battleship had a fine trip of nine and a half days from Bremerton, only the first day out being rough, but even then the battleship was so steady that the crew did not notice the rough seas. The Wisconsin carries a crew of about 700, and it was noticeable that most of the sailors were young fellows. They are apprentices, having served on the training ships to get their sea-legs, and are now taking their first voyage on a real fighting machine. The majority of the boys came from inland states, and are ruddy-faced, sturdy-framed types of the real American youth.

"It's quite remarkable," said an officer, "that most of our crew is American, and you can say that it is practically an all-American crew."

"And they can play baseball, too," suggested a young midshipman, who looked as if he was something of a fan.

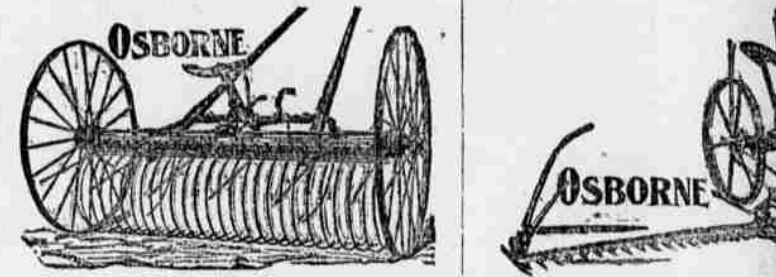
