The common council of the city of Toledo met in adjourned session. Present-Mayor Sturdevant, Aldermen Dick, Hall, Plumlee and Peterson, Recorder Krogstad.
Minutes of the last regular meeting read and approved.
Petition by J. Ofstedahl, Austin Rosebrook and others asking for the construction of a regulation sidewalk in front of lot No. - biock No. -, ex teuding 50 feet from corner of ith and Hillstreet On motion petition granted unanimously.
On motion the following claims were allowed. Stone Wells, labor on streets, \$3; B. F Swope, drawing ordinance. \$2. Ordinance No. 46, relatiog to nuisances, read first time in full and twice by title, and on motion referred until next meeting for its third reading and final passage.
The following resolution was introduced by Alderman James Plumlee and seconded by alderman C. A. Dick: "Moved that we submit to the legal voters of the city of Toledo, Oregon, the question as to whether the present franchise of the Toledo Water and Light company shall be declared for feited and void by reason of said con pany not having complied with terms of said frauchise; and also as to whet her or not a new franchise shall be granted unto said water company, limiting the life of said new franchise to 10 years and lowering the rate per hydrant to be paid by said city to said water company v under said proposed new charter from What said rates are under the present franshise. That a special election for the purpose above named will be held in said city of Toledo on the - day of -_, 1908, sald special election to be g verned by the general laws of the State of Oregon relating to general, tate and county elections in said state and that said special electiou be suthorized to be held in said city on the said - day of -- 1903. Signed, J Plumlee." On motion the resolation was adopted.
On motion the time for receiving bids for gradiug intersection of 9 th and Hil streets war extended until next regular meeting.
On motion of Peterson, seconded by Plumiee, the marshal was ordered til haye dirt removed from east side cro:s. ing.of Hill und 3d strents.
On motion of Wells, seconded by Plumlee, the marshal was ordered to have Ciraham street between 4th -treet and Siletz road bill put in passable con dition.
On motion of Peterson, seconded by Hall, regulation sidewalk was ordered constructed by property owners on east site of Hill street between 2d and 5th streets, the same to be tinished within 90 days from date.
H. W. Vincent was elected conncil
man to serve the unexpired term of James Anderson, resigned.
On motion council adjourned.
