### For the Public Good.

While the improvement of roads and the building of bridges is being discussed and materialized, it may not be out of place to mention the fact that Lincoln county is placed to a large and unnecessary expense every year by the thoughtless carelessness, or pure carelessness of some of our citizens by the obstruction of our waterways with brush or trees thrown or fallen in the streams. Report comes from Big Elk that these conditions are common there, and the result is, each year some bridge is either carried away or greatly damaged by the weight of accumulated debris, such as logs, fallen trees or brush.

The practice of obstructing the Big Elk should be stopped—not only because of the damage done to the bridges, but to the fish hatchery as well. The government has been to big expense in locating this hatchery for the benefit of people in common and it is the duty of every citizen to report to the fish warden or the county commissioners, any violation of the law, regarding the obstruction of waterways. Following is a little law on the case:

"Any person or persons who shall willfully, wantonly or negligently cut, fall, throw, or place in any running stream in this state, of sufficient capacity to float any saw log, or logs, or in any drainage ditch in this state, any tree, brush, log, or drift, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars or more than fifty dollars: Provided always, that this act shall not apply to saw logs placed in streams for driving or rafting."

In another column of THE LEADER may be seen a communication from the editor who is now taking a vacation in the middle states. Judging from its tone, however, it is plain to be seen that he will be content to remain in Lincoln county hereafter.

The death of Pope Leo XIII removes one of the greatest statesmen of the last decade. He was in the 83rd year of his age and for the past quarter of a century has wielded the scepter of spiritual sovereignty in sympathy with modern society and government. His death was due to pleuro-pneumonia.

The Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station has issued Bulletin No. 76. 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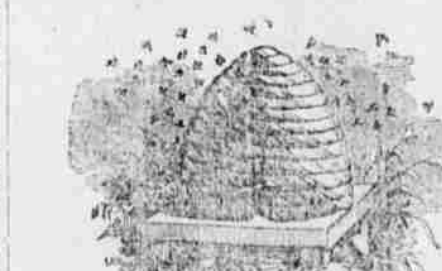
