Election News.

Municipal and state elections were held in several states Tuesday, with mixed results.
The contest in Greater New York resulted in a victory for the Tammany candidate for mayor, George B. McClellan, Jr., son of the civil war general, who defeated his Fusionist opponent, Mayor Seth Low, by over 60,000. The main issue was gambling and open saloons on Sunday, and the "wide open" element won.
Ohio rolls up a majority of 125,000 for Herrick, Republican candidate for governor, whose Democratic opponent was the famous Tom Johnson. There were large Republican gains all over the state.
Beckham, Democrat, is re-elected governor of Kentucky by a majority of about 15,000. It was a hot day in the Blue Grass state, with heavy firing all along the line and a large number killed and wounded.
Bates, Republican, is re-elected governor of Massachusetts by a margin of 25,000, the rest of the state Republican ticket also being elected.
In New Jersey it was a legislative contest, and the Republicans will have a majority of 31 on joint ballot in the next legislature.
Pennsylvania gives Mathus, the Republican candidate for State treasurer, a plurality of about 265,000 with the other candidates on the ticket close up.
Garvin, Democrat, is probably re-elected governor of Rhode Island, but by a greatly reduced plurality. Late-Garvin's plurality 1585. Republicans control the legislature.
Colorado's election was for the purpose of selecting a member of the Supreme Court, and Campbell, Republican, won out with a margin of about 7,000.
Cummins, Republican, is re-elected governor of Iowa by a plurality of 50,000, carrying the entire ticket with him.
Like Colorado, Nebraska's contest was for Supreme Judge, Barnes, Republican, defeating Sullivan, Democrat, by a margin of 8,000. Very good, by the way, for Bryan's state.
The municipal election in San Francisco resulted in the re-election of Mayor Schmitz, Union-Labor candidate, with Crocker, Republican, a good second, and Lane, Democrat, getting the distance flag. The other offices were divided among all parties.
Substantial Republican gains are shown in all except the municipal elections where party lines were not drawn. The result is highly satisfactory—striking an average.

William Jennings Bryan has been saying some more naughty things about Grover Cleveland, which seems to indicate that there are still two or more wings to the Democratic party; also that both William and Grover are still ambitious to be II.

If Oregon has any honest men of prominence or eminence, they should be placed on exhibition at the St. Louis Fair as soon as it opens. Just at present, it seems, all our 'way-up men are either under indictment or under suspicion. In fact, the editors of the state alone stand on a level with the late lamented Caesar.

Some of our faint-hearted contemporaries have decided that Yaquina Bay has been shut out again in the matter of an appropriation. They should be calm. The military gentlemen comprising the board of engineers who recently "sat upon" our case understand their business thoroughly. They'll give us good news in due time, but let it leak out in tiny drops, so to speak, and thus avoid producing a dangerous shock.

Commissioners' Court Order.

In the matter of the Salmon River road:
At this time came on for consideration the leasing of the Salmon river road in Lincoln county, Oregon.
And it duly appearing to the court that said road is so located that there is little or no local labor along the line of said road and that it is advisable to lease said road to some person or corporation to open, improve and keep the same in repair, and the court being fully advised in its premises.
It is ordered that said road be leased as by law provided that said leased road begin at a point at or near Devil's Lake and near the ocean beach at the Pacific ocean in said Lincoln county and running thence in an easterly direction along the line of said road to a point on the east line of said Lincoln county, the same a distance of about 14 miles; that there shall be erected and maintained on said road one toll gate; the grade of said road shall be a 10 per cent grade. The materials for the construction of said road shall be lumber, or corduroy with the material usual in constructing such a road, at the option of the lessee of said road, and the period of time for which said road shall be leased shall be for a period of 10 years from date of the contract for leasing the same; the bid or bids shall specify the unit or rate of toll upon a sheep or hog which the bidder is willing to accept for keeping said road, and such bid shall be deemed a bid for tolls as to the other items or classes mentioned in section 4917 B. C. Code of Oregon, in the proportion of such unit or rate as specified in section 4918 of said code; and that the county clerk of said Lincoln county shall cause this order to be published in the Lincoln County Leader, a weekly newspaper of general circulation in said county for a period of not less than 4 weeks, and in like manner to give notice therewith that sealed bids will be received at said clerk's office for the leasing of said road until the 17th day of November, 1903 and up to the hour of 10 a. m. thereof, and not more than 10 days after the expiration of said publication of this order and notice.
