In Her Stocking.

There seems to be no escape, says the Chicago Inter Ocean, from the delicate task of commenting upon the misfortune which has befallen Mrs. Francis Sterling, a rich English widow, residing in New York.

Mrs. Sterling, it seems, has long been a collector of rare and beautiful gems. Some of these gems she has been fond of wearing and others she has been fond of carrying in a box, her custom being to carry the box in her stocking. Her ready money she has also carried in this box, which she has invariably carried in her stocking, drawing from it on her shopping tours or travels only such change as from time to time she found it necessary to use.

On Thursday she returned from Washington. Just before leaving the sleeping-car in Jersey City, she put the box in its accustomed place—that is to say, in her stocking. She is quite sure that there was no hole in her stocking when she dressed, and yet when she arrived home the box was missing. Moreover, there was a large hole in the stocking through which the box had escaped. Its contents were very valuable, as may be judged by the fact that she offers a reward of \$1,000 for return of them "and no questions asked."

It seems as if this ought to prove a lesson to women in general, whether they are foreign or native. Thousands of them are said to be more or less in the habit of carrying in their stockings things that do not properly belong there. There is no particular objection that we can see to carrying bank bills of large denomination in this way, but, on the other hand, women who crowd their stockings with silver coin, bank books, jewel boxes, letters, keys, theater tickets, receipts, and miscellaneous personal and household bric-a-brac, not only run serious risk, but subject themselves to an uncomfortable and ungraceful gait.

A woman's stocking is a useful article, and no possible objection can be made to its legitimate employment. There are times, doubtless, when a woman has no other safe place in which to store small articles of value, but the stocking habit is likely to be carried to excess.

In our opinion there are too many things carried in women's stockings that should be placed in the safety deposit vaults or in storage warehouses, and, if we are correctly informed in regard to the matter, we sincerely hope that Mrs. Sterling's experience may lead to a much-needed reform.
