Council Proceedings.

Council Chamber, Toledo, Or.,
April 9, 1904.

Common Council of the city of Toledo met in called session. Present—Mayor Vincent, Councilmen Anderson, Arnold, Van Cleve and Rosebrook and Recorder Krogstad.

Councilman elect M. N. Anderson took the oath of office and took his place in the Council.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Upon motion the following claims were allowed under suspension of the rules:

Toledo Water and Electric Light Co., water rent for March, 1904. \$30 00
Hall & Anderson, hauling lumber 50
Otto O Krogstad, recorder's salary and supplies. 8 90
Yaquina Bay Mercantile Co., office rent and gasoline. 13 70
Wm F Enos, labor on streets. 2 50
J A Hall, salary as marshal and labor on streets. 21 50

Moved by Councilman Dick and seconded by Councilman Rosebrook that that part of the resolution passed at last meeting ordering hydrant removed from west side of Hill street to corner of Fifth and Grove streets be rescinded and instead the hydrant be ordered placed at corner of Grove and Fourth streets, in front of Episcopal church. Carried.

The mayor here appointed M. N. Anderson to fill vacancies of all committees due to the resignation of Councilman A. T. Peterson, and also on special city ball building committee.

Moved by Councilman Rosebrook and seconded by Councilman Arnold that we purchase an undivided one-half interest in lot 6 block 6, Graham's 5th addition to Toledo, from Mrs. Mary A. Day, providing first a division may be secured giving city ownership to the east or west one-half of said lot. Carried.

Moved by Councilman Rosebrook and seconded by Councilman Van Cleve that grade as established by survey of A. L. Porter on Graham street between Third and Fourth streets be vacated and that we order established instead the grade as shown by plat A now on file as surveyed by County Surveyor M. Wygant for Toledo Water Company. Carried.

Moved by Councilman Van Cleve and seconded by Councilman Rosebrook that recorder be authorized to draw a warrant in favor of Mary A. Day for \$25, to be turned over to her in lieu of a satisfactory warranty deed to the east or west one-half of lot 6 block 6, Graham's 5th addition to Toledo. Carried.

Moved by Councilman Van Cleve and seconded by Councilman Arnold that marshal be instructed to have erected two posts, with cross bar, on east side of railroad track at crossing in front of T. P. Fish's store, and that notices be posted indicating sidewalk in dangerous condition. Carried.

Moved by Councilman Arnold and seconded by Councilman Rosebrook that street committee be instructed to investigate reason for fencing up of road along water front leading to city wharf at First street. Carried.

On motion Council adjourned.
