That Toledo Bluejacket.

U. S. S. Wisconsin / Olongapo, Subig Bay, P. I., April 7
Dear Folks:—Well, the mail closes for the United States on the 9th, but it leaves here today for Manila, so I will write you a few lines to let you know that I am not dead and to find out how things are progressing there. We came up here yesterday from Manila or rather Cavite, and I don't know just how long we are to remain, but only a few days, I fancy. We are to go to Hong Kong on or about the 1st of May for dry docking; then I don't

know where will go.

We are to play an eight-numbered concert over at the Marine barracks this evening. I may have forgotten to tell you that there are 500 marines quartered at this place. They are going to build a big navy yard at this place move the Cavite yard up here.

We are to "rate" 28 men in this band now. P. H. Cooper is commander-in-chief of the station and the Wisconsin is his flag-ship. So now we are to have a fine band. We expect to get about ten off the transport Buffalo when she gets here. She is from New York and is due next week; also the cruiser Baltimore and five torpedo boats. We are going to ship Filipinos, they are fine musicians, and good string players, so we may have an orchestra.

I did not get a letter in the last mail. What is the matter? Now I want you to write oftener or I will have to let a month or two go by without writing. I write to you in every mail that leaves here, and I want you to write once a week from there; also send the papers so I can keep track of the doings there.

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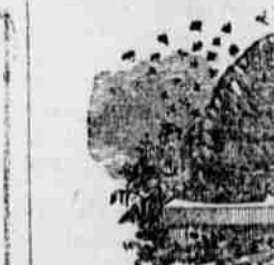
