COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

Doings of the City Dads in Regular Session.

Council Chamber, Toledo, Or.,
October 3, 1904.

The common council of the city of Toledo met in regular session. Present—Mayor H. W. Vincent; Councilmen R. A. Arnold, M. N. Anderson, Austin Rosebrook, T. P. Fish, R. S. Van Cleve and Recorder Otto Krosgstad. Absent Councilman J. R. Turnidge.

Minutes of last regular meeting read, and upon motion adopted, including following amendment: "That warrant drawn in favor of Gus Olson for \$50 bear no interest until one year from date."

The following claims against the city were allowed under suspension of the rules:

Joe Hill, 6 lamp posts and digging holes, \$5 50
J. A. Hall, salary as Marshal and labor, 29 75
Hall & Anderson, draying, 1 00
F. W. Carson, blacksmith work on jail, 75
Otto O. Krosgstad, salary as Recorder and lamp supplies, 10 00

Committee on ordinances presented Ordinance No. 47, entitled: "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Feeding of Horses or Any Other Stock on the Planking on Hill Street."

On motion Ordinance No. 47 was read for the first time in full, the second time by title, and laid over until next meeting for its third reading and final passage.

Following is the ordinance:
Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Toledo, Oregon:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful to feed horses or any other stock on the planking on Hill street.
Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful to scatter any hay or straw on the planking on Hill street, which may endanger the safety of property in case of fire.

Sec. 3. Any violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars, or not less than two days nor more than five days in the city jail, or both.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication or posting, as by law required.

Councilman J. R. Turnidge having resigned, upon motion his resignation was accepted, and C. H. Gardner was the unanimous choice of the Council to fill the vacancy.

On motion the committee on streets was instructed to circulate among the citizens a petition in order to ascertain what amount of money and labor will be donated toward the grading of road leading to city wharf at foot of First street along railroad right-of-way.

On motion Council adjourned.
