The Portland Journal says Booker T. Washington is a bigger and better man than August Belmont. The Journal does stagger onto the truth occasionally.

A large number of Japanese on the Pacific coast have received orders to come home and take a hand in the war against Russia. This means a shortage of men for railroad construction work, etc., and a lot of poor, abused white men who have been kicking against the employment of Japanese labor will now have a chance to get jobs.

A change has come over the spirit of Andrew Carnegie's dreams. He declares that he will support the Republican ticket, although still opposed to the expansion idea. Four years ago Mr. Carnegie was a red-hot supporter of Bryan and contributed liberally to the campaign fund, but he has seen the light and says: "I am convinced that Republican rule is best for the country." Mr. Carnegie isn't the only prodigal son. The country is full of 'em.

In Colorado, a few days ago, a mock stage robbery resulted in the serious wounding of one of the mock bandits. The "thrilling episode" was being enacted in a secluded spot for the benefit of some moving-picture artists, when some tenderfoot tourists from the east appeared upon the scene and opened fire. This is a pointer as to how these hair-raising moving pictures are obtained, all of which, however, do not contain so much of the real thing.

After General Miles, a brave, efficient and honored soldier, becomes too old to serve his country longer in that capacity and is placed upon the retired list with a good salary, or pension, he begins to indulge in that foolish babble about "imperialism," "militarism," "Napoleonism," etc. In view of the fact that all of General Miles' fame comes from his ability as a fighting man, his present attitude must be charged to either dishonesty or a disordered mind. Charitable persons will give the old man the benefit of the doubt and sympathize with him in his putniness.

Some Russian war vessels found something they could whip the other night when they fired upon an English fishing fleet in the North sea. One of the fishing boats was sunk, two men killed and several wounded. As the fishermen were unarmed, the Russians had no casualties to report. The Russians evidently mistook the fishing fleet for Japanese torpedo boats and were so badly frightened they opened fire upon them without investigating. Of course, Russia will apologize and pay a good round sum for the blunder. They wouldn't last much longer than fishing boats in a mixup with England's navy.

The Portland Journal appeals editorially to the Lewis and Clark Fair management and the people of Portland generally to adopt an honest and liberal policy during the Fair; to cut out all hold-ups and make visitors glad they came. The suggestion is timely and proper. The Lewis and Clark Fair should be more than a mere exhibit, such as the Chicago and St. Louis expositions. Thousands of visitors will be home-seekers and they should receive only good impressions. 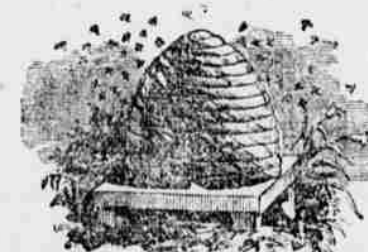
