Igorottes Set Sail.

Two hundred Igorottes, Moros, Negri-
toes and Visayans left the Philippine
islands last week and will arrive in
Portland the latter part of this month,
where they will proceed immediately to
the grounds of the Lewis and Clark
Exposition. The natives will populate
the Philippine village on the Govern-
ment peninsula at the exposition.

Upon their arrival, the construction
of the Philippine village will be started
at once. A feature of this will be a
city of houses built of poles over the
surface of Guild's Lake. This is char-
acteristic of the expedient resorted to
by the natives to avoid reptiles and
foes of similar kind. The city of pole
houses will be occupied by the Moros,
who with the Igorottes stand lowest in
the scale of civilization.

Boiled dog will represent the princi-
pal sustenance of the Igorottes, who
are conceded to be epicureans regard-
ing this delicacy. The general supposi-
tion is that a hearty meal of boiled,
fried or roasted canine adds fervor to
the fighting prowess of Igorotte war-
riors. Accordingly, the dog flesh is
served only to the males, the fairer sex
being denied the rare treat.

Visitors to the centennial, however,
need have no fear of witnessing a blood-
curdling combat, unless the Portland
police should become obstreperous in
the presence of the Igorottes, which
would naturally result in a lively
seance.
