Mc J. Wood is the duly appointed, qualified and acting agent for said company with full power to represent it in all and every partic- ular respecting said land of said com- pany; that on about the 1st day of Febru- ary, 1905, said company tendered to the Sheriff of Lincoln county, Oregon, the sum of \$1291.43 in full payment of its taxes for the years 1899 and 1900, but said Sheriff could not accept the same on account of said penalty and interest, neither could the county clerk of said county accept the same or issue redemption certificates on account of said penalty and interest; that said lands were sold to Lincoln county, Oregon, for said taxes March 1, 1902, and again March 2, 1903; that the assess- ments for said years 1899 and 1900 are erroneous and invalid for the reason

said property is not all properly de- scribed and is assessed above its cash value, contrary to the express provi- sions of the law relating thereto; that said company, for the purpose of set- tling said taxes amicably and without litigation, is willing to pay the sum of \$1291.43 in full payment for all said taxes for said years. The Court being fully advised in the premises, and hav- ing carefully examined said petition, it is ordered by this Court, sitting as a Court for the transaction of county business, that the county clerk of Lin- coln county, Oregon, receive and accept the said sum of \$1291.43 in full pay- ment of the taxes on said lands of said company for the years 1899 and 1900, and also issue redemption certificates to said company or its successor in interest, as by law provided; and it is further ordered that said penalty and interest in the sum of \$332.44 be re- mitted to said company or its succes- sors in interest.
