the Goverument without the consent o the individual lodian and the state und that the emanci pation from Fedora control is not uffected by the tact tha the lands it has granted to the Indial are granted sulject to a conditio sualust uilenation and iucumbracee, or interest in tribal or other property," This decision apparently applies to the Indiaus of the siletz reservation
and all other Iudians bolding land in sereraty. In due time a dection is ez pected declaring such land sabject to
axation-the sime as that of any other taxation-the same as that of any othe
cilizen.
