REDUCED EXCURSION RATES

To the Seaside and Mountain Resorts
for the Summer Vacations.

On and after June 1, 1905, the South-
ern Pacific, in connection with the Cor-
vallis & Eastern railroad will have on
sale round trip tickets from points on
their lines to Newport, Yaquina and
Detroit at very low rates, good for re-
turn until October 10, 1905.

Three day tickets to Newport and
Yaquina, good going Saturdays and re-
turning Mondays are also on sale from
all east side points Portland to Eugene
inclusive, and from all west side points,
enabling people to visit their families
and spend Sunday at the seaside.

Season tickets from all east side
points Portland to Eugene inclusive,
and from all west side points are also
on sale to Detroit at very low rates with
stop over privileges at Mill City or any
point east enabling tourists to visit the
Sautiam and Breitenbush Hot Springs
in the Cascade mountains, which can
be reached in one day.

Season tickets will be good for return
from all points until October 10th.
Three day tickets will be good going
Saturdays and returning Mondays
only. Tickets from Portland and vicinity
will be good for return via the Lebanon-
Springfield branch, if desired. Bag-
gage on Newport tickets checked
through to Newport; on Yaquina tick-
ets to Yaquina only.

S. P. trains connect with the C. & E.
at Albany and Corvallis for Yaquina
and Newport. Trains on the C. & E.
for Detroit will leave Albany at 7:30 a.
m., enabling tourists to the Hot Springs
to reach there the same day. Trains
from and to Corvallis connect with all
east side trains on the S. P.

Contrary to the impression which ap-
pears to be held by some persons of in-
