The Next Campaign.

Political warfare at the general election of Oregon will commence much earlier hereafter than was the case before the direct primary nominations law was passed, for the act provides that there shall be a primary election 45 days before the general election, says the Evening Telegram. The next primaries in this state will be held in April of 1906. The campaign will begin much earlier, for the candidates will have to make themselves solid with the people many days before the primaries.

Hence it is not at all unlikely that there will be campaigners among the people as early as February, while in March the woods will be full of them. In the good old days when the conventions did the work there was nothing to do other than to elect the delegates. The candidates were still in the background. The conventions were held about a month before the day of the election, and the actual campaign on the part of the candidate did not begin until after the nominations had been made by the convention.

But now these days are of yore and the candidate who hopes to be the nominee of his party by the vote at the primaries must sally forth upon the highways and byways early in the game. Yea, before the last of Winter's sabbie train has melted into the viewless air. There will be fences to build, signatures to get, support to rustle from the great plains of voters. Indeed, he will be a busy man, and if he is successful at the primaries he must do it all over again and convince the populace that the nominees of the opposite political primaries are inferior to him. Wherefore he must battle for office from the break of the cold, bleak months until the torrid rays of advancing summer slant across his fevered brow.

True, it seems that the direct primary nominations law was not made for the comfort of the man who wants to fill the people's offices.

Will G. Gilstrap is no longer editor and half owner of the Eugene Register, having sold his interest to Earl G. Davis and O. W. Briggs of Paw Paw, Illinois, his brother, W. F., retaining the other half. The retiring editor has helped to make the register the best newspaper on the coast in cities of Eugene's class, and he will be missed, even though his successors keep the Register up to its present high standard.

Big Preachers for Fair Services

Leading exponents of various creeds will speak at the Sunday services at the Lewis and Clark Exposition, which are held in the Auditorium, at four each Sunday afternoon. The list of those who will preach during the Exposition includes some of the best known divines from all parts of the country, and assures the popularity of the services. On Sunday the admission to the grounds has been reduced from 50 to 25 cents. The gates are opened at noon, and the exhibit palaces are open until 6 o'clock. The amusement features on the Trail are not permitted to run.

July 30—Rev. Thomas E. Sherman, S. J., of St. Louis University, a son of Gen. W. T. Sherman, and a well-known Roman Catholic priest, will speak.

August 6—Sermon by Rev. Charles M. Sheldon, author of "In His Steps," of Topeka, Kansas.

August 13—Address by Josiah Strong, D. D., author of "Our Country" and several other works, and president of the American League for Civil Service.

Beyond August 13 only tentative programs have been prepared, but the same high standard will be maintained at the Sunday services. The Auditorium at the Exposition, where the Sunday meetings will be held, seats 3000, and was built for such occasions. The first of the preaching services, June 18, at which Dr. Robert McIntyre of Los Angeles, known as the bricklayer preacher, was the speaker, was a distinct success, and prospects are that the services to be held during the Exposition period will be the most notable ever held on the Pacific coast.
