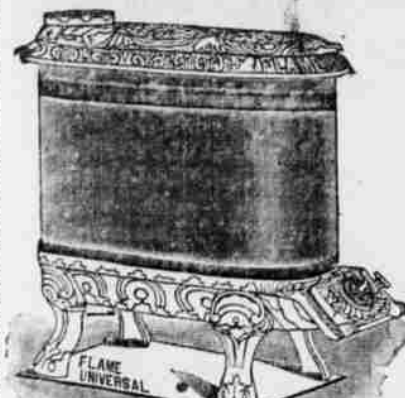

Registration of Land Title.
In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for
