In the matter of the vacation of the S Romtvedt road of public easement. At this time came on to be heard the petition of S Romtvedt, Sr., praying for an order of this Court vacating all that part of a certain road of public easement running over a certain portion of his real estate, which said road of public easement was ordered by this Court on the 8th day of April, 1903, and recorded on page 74, Journal No. 3, of said Court, and said road being described as follows, to wit: Beginning at the house located on the east half of northwest quarter and southwest quarter of northeast quarter of section 31, township 10 south, range 10 west; thence north along the foot of the hill to the intersection of the line between northeast quarter of section 81, township 10 south, range 10 west; thence east along said line to the intersection of the county road. And it further appearing to the Court that the sums of money assessed as damages to the property owners over which said road was to pass has never been paid, nor any part thereof; that said road has never been opened or used for any purpose whatsoever, and that said S. Romtvedt is now the owner in fee simple of the land over which said road passes, and it further appearing that said road is of no benefit to any person or persons residing in the vicinity thereof, and the Court being fully advised in the premises, it is ordered and decreed by the Court that said road of public easement be and the same is hereby vacated and held for naught.

At this time came on to be heard and for consideration the matter of publishing the delinquent tax list for the year 1904, and it duly appearing to the Court that three bids have been duly submitted to the Court for publishing said list as follows, to wit: The LINCOLN COUNTY LEADER offered in writing to publish the same at 10 cents per square for each insertion thereof; the Toledo Reporter submitted an offer in writing to publish the same at 5 cents a square for each insertion, and the Yaquina Bay News also offered to publish the same at 4 cents per square for each insertion thereof; and the Court having carefully examined said matter and being fully advised in the premises, it is therefore ordered that the publication of the delinquent tax list for the year 1904 be published in the Toledo Reporter in accordance with its bid and contract herein filed, the said Toledo Reporter being hereby designated by the Court as most likely to give actual notice to delinquent taxpayers, and that said notice shall be published in manner and form as by law provided in such cases and in accordance with the terms of said bid and contract; and it is further ordered that said Toledo Reporter enter into an undertaking with sufficient sureties, to be approved by the County Court, to publish said delinquent list according to the terms of its contract for the publication thereof.
