STARS FOR VOYAGERS.

Line Used by Navigators to Place a Ship's Location.

There are nine eminent nautical stars considered by navigators. They are important as determining the position of the ship at the time the observation is taken, calculated by their distance from the moon. The stars are Alpha, Arctis, the principal star of Arles, but of the second grade; Aldebaran, first magnitude, in the rich as terision of Taurus, easily distinguished by its red color; Poflux, second magnitude, in Gemini, readily known by its companionship with the brighter Castor; Regulus, a first class star in the breast of Leo (hence often called Cor Leonis, the Lion's Heart); Spica Virginis, a first class star in Virgo, remarkably conspicuous from being insulated in a dark surrounding field Alpha Aquilae, generally known as Altair, first magnitude; Alpha Pegasi second class, usually termed Narkab Antares, first magnitude, in Scorpio distinguished by its fiery red color. Fomalhaut, first class, in Piscis Australis. These stars are conveniently situated with reference to the moon's path and are used for taking tables of lunar distances by makers of nautical almanacs in order to enable vessel masters to deduct their longitude. The distances of the center of the moon from some of the nine conspicuous stars near the ecliptic are computed with the utmost care for every three hours during the year at Greenwich. When on the broad ocean the navigator finds his position by marking when such a lunar distance, set down accurately in the almanac for the day and hour, occurs, as seen from his own vessel, and deduces thereby his whereabouts on the watery waste.—Milwaukee Free Press.
