He came to Oregon in 1897 and took up a homestead on lower Siletz, where he has since resided. He leaves a wife and three children, Maurice Andersen, and Mrs. J. A. Read of Lower Siletz and Niels Andersen, Jr., who is now absent on the Schooner Delta. Their launch went to sea and has not since been heard of.


