In the matter of the petition for local option liquor election for Lincoln County, State of Oregon. At this time came on to be heard the petition of Geo W Myers, petitioning that on Monday, the 4th day of June, 1906, an election be held to determine whether the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in said Lincoln county as a whole, and it appearing to the Court therefrom that said petition is signed by more than 10 per cent of the registered voters of said Lincoln county, Oregon, basing said percentage on the total vote cast in said Lincoln county at the last preceding general election for Justice of the Supreme Court of said State, that said petition was duly filed with the County Clerk of said Lincoln county on the 3d day of April, 1906, that said petition is in due form and regularly drawn in conformity with the Local Option Liquor Law of the State of Oregon, and the Court being fully advised in the premises, and having carefully examined said petition, it is ordered that an election be held in Lincoln county, Oregon, on the 4th day of June, 1906, to determine whether the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be prohibited in such county, other than for scientific and manufacturing purposes, and wine to church officials for sacramental purposes and for medical purposes upon written prescription of a regular practicing physician, as by law provided; that said election shall be governed by the general election laws of the State of Oregon.
