Speaking of Candidates.

It is not necessary that the contents of THE LEADER should be a hymn of praise, net, dedicated to the Republican candidates. Some of these gentlemen are well-known to nearly every voter in Lincoln county. They are now holding official positions, and the records, which every voter may examine, speak for them. THE LEADER will gladly give space to any voter who desires to file a charge of official dishonesty or incompetency against one of them. Every honest voter desires a manly and clean campaign, and the candidate who cannot win out on his own merits deserves defeat. While a few silly yarns have been circulated during the past few days against some of the Republican nominees, they have been of the harmless variety—harmless except to the circulators.

Lincoln county is Republican by a large majority, and it is useless for minority party candidates to beg Republican votes on the ground that there is "no politics in it." If there is "no politics in it," why are they trying to march into office under a party banner and take the places of officials whose records are as good or better than they themselves would be able to make? The Republican ticket from top to bottom and up again is worthy the support of every Republican in the county. It was selected by the voters themselves at the primary nominating election, and the voters without doubt know their own wishes and their own business better than office-hungry minority candidates can tell it to them.
