The County's Indebtedness.

It has been brought to the attention of THE LEADER that certain persons are trying to make the people of Lincoln county believe the county's indebtedness, under our present officials, is rapidly increasing, and in order to satisfy ourselves, and for the information of the people of this county, we have taken the following from the various reports now on file in the County Clerk's office:

According to the semi-annual report of the County Clerk, Hurley Lutz, filed in October, 1898, the outstanding warrants were \$31,920; interest on same to September 30, 1898, \$3,404.80; funds in hands of County Treasurer on September 30, 1898, to be applied on payment of said warrants and interest, \$2,591.76, leaving the county's indebtedness on September 30, 1898, about three months after Mr. Stewart assumed his duties as County Judge, \$32,733.04.

On September 15, 1901, according to the expert report of J. H. Wilson, the amount of principal on outstanding warrants was \$48,131.76 and interest thereon, \$5,599.25; funds in the hands of the County Treasurer, to be applied on payment of said principal and interest, \$8,122.78, leaving the county's indebtedness on September 15, 1901, \$45,608.23.

According to the semi-annual report of Hurley Lutz, County Clerk, on March 31, 1902, the outstanding warrants amounted to \$49,479.39 and the interest thereon amounted to \$3,982.21; funds in the hands of the County Treasurer to be applied on the payment of said principal and interest, \$11,455.03, leaving the county's indebtedness on March 31, 1902, \$42,006.57.

According to the semi-annual report of County Clerk, Ira Wade, the amount of outstanding warrants on the 1st day of April, 1906, was \$42,167.84 and interest thereon, \$4,427.64; funds in the hands of the County Treasurer on the 1st day of April, 1906, to be applied on the payment of said principal and interest, \$10,214.78, leaving the county's indebtedness on April 1, 1906, \$36,420.10.

It will, therefore, be seen that during Mr. Stewart's term of office the county's indebtedness increased at the rate of over \$2,300 per year, while since the expiration of his term of office the county's indebtedness has decreased at the rate of over \$1,300 per year.

These are a few interesting facts—not campaign yarns that are being circulated over the county without the backing of the records.

Calls Us an ex-Pop.

Woody Bill of the Newport News now comes to the front with the startling statement that he was fighting for the Republican party when the editor of THE LEADER (that's us) was doing a Populist stunt in Nebraska.
