Your favor of the 14th instant has been under consideration by this office for several days, and in reply I beg to say the County Court a right to accept pay ment of a less amount of taxes than the amount entered on the tax roll. While the validity of which are doubtful, I am unable to find that the county has the right to reduce the valuation of property after the roll has been equalized by the board of equalization or the County Court, sitting as such.

To accept payment of taxes in such an amount as the Court deems to be the tax on a fair valuation of the property where it appears to have been overvalued would Roots.
