or roads or portions thereof desired to be improved with the funds arising from said special road tax, giving the initial and terminal points of the desired improvements, with the character and extent and estimated cost thereof. The Court being fully advised in the premises, it is ordered that the road supervisor act as road master in said matter in said road district, and he is hereby directed to prepare plans and specifications of the improvements decided upon and to advertise for bids by posting notices for a period of 10 days in three public places in said road district for making said improvements; and if the road or roads upon which said improvements are to be made have not been surveyed and platted as by law provided, then said road master shall require the County Surveyor, or some other competent engineer, to survey and plat the same in the manner provided for laying out county roads; and it is further ordered that said improvements shall be under the supervision of said road master, and he shall be governed by, and such improvements shall be made in accordance with, the provisions of the law relating to the construction and improvement of county roads out of the general fund, wherever the same may be applicable.
