Harvey Scott and H. L. Pittcock, owners of the Oregonian, are up against a libel suit brought by W. M. Ladd. A few days ago there appeared in the Oregonian a cartoon showing Mr. Ladd apparently endorsing a sentiment hinting at the coming assassination of President McKinley, which appeared in a New York Hearst paper in 1898.
