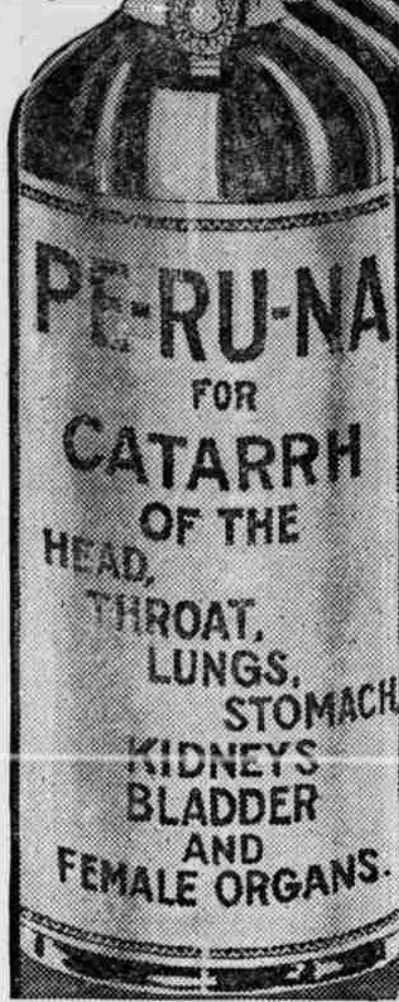

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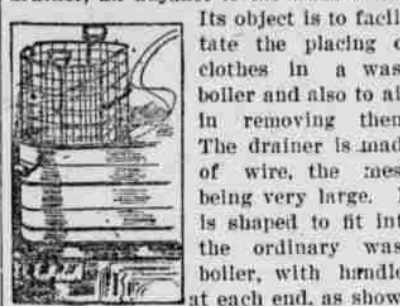

Clothes-Drainer.

One of the latest household utensils recently patented is a wash boiler drainer, an adjunct to the wash boiler.



Its object is to facilitate the placing of clothes in a wash boiler and also to aid in removing them. The drainer is made of wire, the mesh being very large. It is shaped to fit into the ordinary wash boiler, with handles at each end, as shown in the illustration. The frame is divided into four sections, which can be readily taken apart and the drainer folded into a small package. The advantages of the drainer will be apparent at once. The clothes to be washed can be easily handled, being placed in or removed from the wash boiler with practically no trouble. A further advantage lies in the fact that the clothes can be raised out of the boiling water and allowed to drain before handling, thus avoiding danger of scalding the hands.

Sandwiches.

Dainty sandwiches are made by passing ham through the chopper and adding a suggestion of lemon peel.

By dressing cold halibut with a little mayonnaise and capers.

By using chopped Spanish onions, with or without the lettuce.

By mixing finely-chopped walnuts with cream cheese, and adding a little heavy cream and a pinch of salt.

By preparing a filling of stone olives and green and red (sweet) peppers, both chopped fine.

By covering the bread with thin slices of cucumber over which chopped olives, or grated American cheese, should then be sprinkled.

By passing cold pork and celery through the chopper and seasoning with salt and Worcestershire slightly diluted with water.

Keeping Preserves.

The keeping qualities of preserved fruits and vegetables is greatly impaired by being stored in full daylight. This is especially true when glass jars are used. The jelly will soon become cloudy and dark when thus exposed. Marmalade and other preserves are apt to sour and become mouldy. No matter how well the fruit has been put up and how carefully sterilized and sealed, slow changes in the preserves will take place which, sooner or later, work their destruction. The careful housekeeper will keep close watch over her preserved fruits, and if indication of spoiling appears the jars should be opened.

Cheese Quenelles.

Three ounces of bread crumbs, three ounces of grated cheese, two large eggs, two ounces of butter, one-half gill of boiling water, cayenne pepper and salt. Put water and butter into a pan; add bread crumbs; stir until smooth and hot; then cool; add yolks of eggs and grated cheese; stir lightly in the frothed whites. Add seasoning. Drop mixture from a small teaspoon into hot fat and fry golden brown. Drain and serve hot. White sauce or a well-made, smooth tomato sauce may be passed with these, or they may be served with lettuce, with French dressing.

Beef a la Mode.

Take about two pounds of fresh, lean beef, cut it in pieces about two inches square. Roll each piece in flour; fry in butter or lard one medium-sized onion, sliced. Cook for five minutes, remove onion, place meat in fat and brown carefully. Replace onion with meat, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Pour over whole one-half can tomatoes (strained). Cover meat with water and simmer slowly three hours, adding more water as it cooks away. To serve, cook spaghetti one-half hour and place around platter with meat in center.

Plum Duff.

One quart of flour, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder and a teaspoonful of salt sifted with the flour, one teaspoonful of finely chopped suet. Mix the above ingredients, then add a cup of currants and just enough water to make a stiff dough. Tie up in a cloth, giving room to swell, and drop into a kettle full of boiling water. Boil for one hour, serve hot and eat with brown sugar.

Filling for Chocolate Cake.

One cup of powdered sugar, two tablespoonfuls of cocoa, three tablespoonfuls of milk. Mix sugar and cocoa thoroughly and milk until of the right consistency, then spread on the cake.

Ancient Coffins.

The coffins of the ancient Egyptians were made of marble and stone. The Romans used similar receptacles for their dead, and Alexander the Great is said to have been buried in a coffin of solid gold. In parts of England glass coffins have been found.

The Athenian heroes were buried in coffins made of cedar, owing to its aromatic and incorruptible qualities, while the first record of wooden coffins in England dates back to the days of King Arthur. This monarch was supposed to have been buried in the hollowed trunk of a gigantic oak. Patent coffins were invented in 1796, and metallic air tight coffins were advertised at Birmingham in 1861.
