Oystermen in Session.

Oyster City, Or., Feb. 27, 1907.

At a general meeting of the Yaquina Bay Oystermen's Association held at the home of Joseph Shermer, Micheal Roddy in the chair, George King, secretary, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, In order to restock that part of the natural oyster beds of Yaquina Bay known as Oysterville Flats, be it

Resolved, That we, the undersigned practical and working oystermen of Yaquina Bay, do hereby agree to set apart the whole of said Oysterville Flats from this date until November 10, 1909; and we further agree to plant on said Oysterville Flats one-half of all the shells and young-growth that we shall tong up off and from the natural oyster beds from this date until June 15, 1908; and we further agree that after November 10, 1909, to plant all of the shells and young-growth tonged off the said Oysterville Flats, on the ground designated, after the marketable oysters are culled therefrom; and Micheal Roddy and Alfred Bailey are hereby selected to stake off said Oysterville Flats in sections suitable and direct the planting thereon as the conditions may require.
