Ordinance No. 59.

An Ordinance for permanently improving Fourth street from east side of Hill street to west side of Graham Be it Ordained by the Common Council

of the City of Toledo:

Sec. 1. Fourth street shall be planked from east side of Hill street to west side of Graham street with plank 4 inches wide, 3 inches thick and 12 feet long, laid I inch apart.

Sec. 2. There shall be used 3 stringers 3x6 ioches, laid in flat side and imbedded in ground. All lumber must

Sec. 3. Said plank shall be laid in center of Fourth street, and decking laid as provided in section I and se-curely nailed to the three stringers with not less than No. 30 spikes.

Sec 4. That Fourth street shall be graded by property owners abutting said street to conform to grade and pro-file filed office of City Recorder March 1, 1907, prior to taying said plank road on said street.

Sec. 5. Said permanent improvement shall be completed within 90 days from time this Ordinance goes into effect and be subject to the conditions provided for in section 31 of City Charter.

Sec. 6. Owing to bad condition of said street and heavy travel on same, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect after its publication or posting, as required by law.


