Gust Olson Guilty Again.

District Attorney W. S. McFadden arrived in the city last Saturday from Newport and proceeded to dig up information against Gust Olson, who was strongly suspected of violating the local option law. In a short time Prosecutor McFadden secured the necessary evidence and Gust was invited to appear before Circuit Judge Harris, who told him to call again at 9 o'clock on Monday morning. At the appointed hour Gust was on hand with a plea of guilty. Judge Harris assessed Gust \$200 for his carelessness and warned him to be good. It was Gust's second offense and he was entitled to the limit, but the complaint failed to set forth the fact, which let him down easy.

While in Newport Prosecutor McFadden rounded up Charlie Wiant, Gene Williams and Jack Porter on the same charge. The trouble sellers pleaded guilty and Justice Sylvester taxed them \$100 per head.

District Attorney McFadden promises to keep busy along this line, and liquor selling in Lincoln county will probably prove less profitable than in the past. A great many men will drink, but not many will lie when placed under oath.

Bishop Scadding in Toledo.
