The principal purpose of Secretary Garfield's trip through the Pacific West is to inspect the reclamation work which is in progress. Between this work and the preservation of forests there is an intimate relation. Without forests there can be no constant flow of water; without water there can be no irrigation. Very likely by his travels through this part of the world Mr. Garfield will obtain a more intimate knowledge of the forestry problem than he could by study at a distance. He will learn all there is to know about the objections to the reserves and their advantages. One thing more it is hoped that he will learn, namely, that the people of the West are by no means hostile to forest preservation. Eastern newspapers commonly speak as if the West were unanimous in wishing to strip the country of timber as rapidly as possible, but this is not true. They are misled by the clamor of the grafters and grabbers, who make more noise than their importance warrants.—Oregonian.

Thanks to Ballinger.

Commissioner of the General Land Office Ballinger will have the thanks of thousands of honest land claimants if—as it has been repeatedly reported he would—he lifts the ban placed upon entries and passes them to patent, where no showing of fraud is made. That a great deal of land has been fraudulently acquired not only in Oregon but throughout the west everybody knows. But it does not follow that all the claims, or a majority of them, are now fraudulent. The great majority of the claims are no doubt honest and lawful, and it is not just to this large number of settlers that their proof should thus be held up for months and even years because of the rascality of a few. The government should remember, too, that for many years it permitted and apparently winked at rather loose compliance with the law, and that some things now considered as fraudulent were supposed to be sufficient compliance with the law. Many people formerly did not comply strictly with the law because scarcely anybody did, and everybody supposed that the government's officers were themselves at fault.

But latterly people have learned that the government really requires strict conformity to the law, and homesteaders and other land takers have no doubt governed themselves accordingly. There was not, or at least is not any longer, any good reason for holding up these proofs and presuming them all to be tainted with fraud. This is simply presuming that thousands of American citizens are guilty, without their even being accused because a few others have been found guilty. This is unreasonable, and a shameful wrong upon these citizens, mostly poor and honest men, and Commissioner Ballinger recognizes it as such and is doing all he can to relieve the situation.—Portland Journal.

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
