The New Fad.

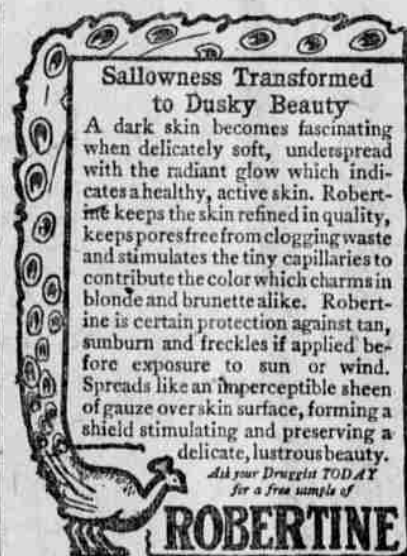
