Straus, Secretary of Commerce and Labor, was given an informal reception at the Commercial Club Saturday night, and, as is now well known, was immediately preceded by Secretary Garfield and Vice President Fairbanks; and your correspondent has yet in store news to announce of the most interesting visit of them all.
