Standard Oil Gets the Limit.

Judge Kenesaw Mountain Landis, in the United States District Court in Chicago last Saturday, fined the Standard Oil Company \$29,340,000 (the limit) for accepting rebates from railroads. While the fine is a very small item from the Standard Oil point of view, the defendant will fight against paying the same to the last ditch, through the higher courts. There are seven more indictments pending against the Standard Oil Company, with maximum fines, upon conviction, aggregating \$88,440,000. When the final verdict is in it will be discovered that the Standard Oil Company has raised the amount of its fines by the simple and old-fashioned plan of touching the consumer for just a little more per gallon. But Judge Landis has done well, and deserves credit for his display of backbone.

Milwaukee's famous gambling joint has been closed and the people of that little city are in deepest mourning garb. The revenue from the illegal business gave Milwaukee electric lights and other metropolitan trimmings, hence the tears. That is one way to look at it. But there is another side to the question. The gambling joint took many thousands of dollars out of the pockets of citizens of Milwaukee and adjacent territory which, in many cases, was needed by their families; and a small fraction of the money squandered at the gaming tables would have made Milwaukee a city beautiful if paid into the treasury as taxes. But that's different. Many a man will howl about the awful burden of taxation and cheerfully feed his last dollar to the tiger. A man's right to make a fool of himself is a popular definition of American liberty.
