## Keep Your Money at Home.

It was somewhat amusing the last few days to note the great fear that struck some of our home people when the failure of the Oregon Savings and Trust Company was announced. A few of our people got bit, and others hustled lively for a time to see if the particular Portland bank in which they had money deposited was still solvent. All of these things lead us to wonder why that Lincoln county money was deposited at Portland. Why was it not deposited at home? Why should a man in Lincoln county take his money to some other part of the state to help that section of the state and to hurt Lincoln county? Lincoln county is in process of development. It needs capital to develop its wonderful resources, and yet there are many of our people who will take a dollar as soon as they get it and take it to Portland and put it into a bank that they know nothing of, except that it advertises big, and then mourn when they get caught. Keep your Lincoln county money in Lincoln county. If you are afraid of our banks, loan it or invest it in some of our growing industries. Don't make a dollar here then act like the county is not good enough to keep it in. Build up Lincoln county.

Next Monday, Sept. 2, is Labor Day.

The State Normal school at Drain opens Sept. 17. Eight thousand dollars have been raised locally to supply the deficiency in the withdrawal of the state appropriation.

Governor Chamberlain last Monday appointed Judge Thomas O'Day, Democrat, to succeed the late Judge Sears, Republican, on the Circuit Court bench for Multnomah county.

The newspapers of Washington county will raise the price of subscription on October 1, fifty per cent. This advance is made imperative by the advance in the prices of paper and printing material.

Secretary of Agriculture James Wilson, who was in Chicago Tuesday on his way to Washington after inspecting the Government forest preserves in the West, declared that if better care, more general propagation and a fostering of conditions are not observed, the forests of the country will practically be wiped out in ten years.

President Walter H. Moore, president of the defunct Oregon Trust & Savings Bank of Portland, decided to Receiver Devlin, to satisfy depositors' claims, his private fortune of 6400 acres of wheat land in Eastern Oregon valued at \$300,000. Cashier Cooper of the same institution says he will, if necessary, sacrifice every cent he has to pay the claims.

The dates for the Oregon State Fair this year are Sept. 16 to 21, one week later than last year. The time has been changed in order to accommodate the thousands of people who will be in the hop fields before this time, and who will all want to take in the greatest fair in the history of the Northwest. The chances of fair weather are also considered better at this time.

Speaker Cannon, when interviewed Tuesday, said: "Am I a candidate for the Republican nomination for President? No; I have not the bee, personally. Would I accept the nomination? No citizen has ever declined it, or ever will. I would rather contribute to making the next session of Congress a success, so that my party will deserve and win success in 1908, than have the Presidency tendered to me on a golden salver."

President E. D. Ressler, of Monmouth Normal School, has deposited with the State Treasurer a certified check for \$3000 which, together with other income, will be sufficient to pay the expenses of the normal school for the first six months of the coming school year, says Saturday's Oregonian. The necessary funds having been provided, the Board of regents will meet and elect a faculty and arrange to have the school operated as long as the funds last. The deposit is in the form of a donation accompanied with an agreement that no claim will be presented to the Legislature for repayment.
