The New School Law.

A new school law passed by the last legislature makes it compulsory that all children between the ages of 9 and 14 attend school for the whole term provided for the district in which they live. Children between the years of 14 and 16 must attend unless regularly employed. The only exception where the child is physically able is in cases where children attend parochial or private schools.

The penalty is fine and imprisonment of the parent after notification by the truant officer. And the law makes it the duty of the teacher to notify the truant officer of any case where attendance is not regular, and any parent can report the teacher for failure to make such report.

The State Text Book Commission has chosen all new books for the ninth grade and all new books for all grades below the ninth except in the case of Thomas' Elementary History and Cyr's fourth and fifth readers.
