Doesn't it seem strange that residents of an ideal hay growing region like this should be compelled to go to the Willamette Valley for their winter's supply of hay? It is a hard proposition to buy hay at all in the Valley this year, and every ton purchased will cost the Toledo consumer \$16 per ton laid down here. Wouldn't it pay our farmers to raise more hay and less corn, mose and brush?

Over at the O. A. C. last Friday a gang attempted to haze a young fellow from Eastern Oregon who had the nerve to defend himself. As a result two of the would-be hazers were put out of business and the balance of the bunch took a hike. One fellow is still confined to his room and two others are nursing bad knife cuts inflicted by the nery East Oregon lad. If the boys must haze they should be very careful to pick out victims they know haven't nerve to fight.

W. B. Glafke, a member of the Board of Governors of the Portland Commercial Club, has put before the Club some intensely interesting figures on the poultry and egg business, for general circulation throughout the state. One hundred carloads of eggs alone were shipped into the state of Oregon during the past twelve months. These would average the year round, \$2300 per car. Oregon growers supply the chief demand for turkeys, ducks, geese, and chickens, but four times the present production would find a ready home market, while in eggs we might multiply by ten and still the prices would pay as well as any product grown either on the farm or in the orchard.

Tom Wolfe and Warren Andrews arrived up from Portland last week in their new automobile which they will use on their auto stage line between Florence and Coos Bay. They made the trip up from Portland in less than two days. They could easily have made it in one day, but both are inexperienced in the handling of automobiles, and thought it best to take it easy. Mr. Wolfe stated that he thought that it would not be long before he and his associates would purchase another machine. Then it will not be necessary to scow across the mouth of the Umpqua river at Gardiner as now. One machine will ply between Gardiner and Coos Bay and the other between Gardiner and Florence. He stated that they intend also to improve the road around the cape a few miles north of Florence, and buy a 3rd machine to place between Florence and Yaquina Bay. This will enable people going from any point in the Valley to make the trip to Coos Bay in a single day, that is, if trains over the C. & E. to Yaquina make the proper connections. The machine brought up is a 22 h. p. Buick and is a beauty.—Eugene Guard.
