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Ordinance No. 65.

An Ordinance relating to the Licensing and Regulating of Draying, Hauling and Teaming:

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Toledo, Oregon:

Section 1. No person, persons, company or corporation shall, within the limits of the City of Toledo, either by self or agent or employee, engage in the occupation of draying, hauling or teaming for hire, without first having obtained a license, which shall be granted upon the payment to the City Recorder of \$10 for one team so engaged, and \$10 for each additional team so engaged, for the term of one year. No license shall be granted for a less period than one year. Provided, that this section shall not in any manner interfere, nor be construed to interfere or conflict with any contract work by this City.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing section shall, upon conviction thereof, before the City Recorder, forfeit and pay a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50 and costs of prosecution, and may be committed to the city jail until the same is paid, not exceeding 20 days.

Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance is hereby repealed.

Section 4. Whereas, the ordinance bearing on this subject is indefinite, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor and its publication or posting as required by law.

Ordinance No. 64.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 43, relating to licensing of pool tables, billiard tables, pigeon-hole table, bowling alleys, shooting galleries and slot machines:

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the city of Toledo, Oregon:

Section 1. That the title of said Ordinance No. 43 be amended to read:

An Ordinance relating to licensing of billiard tables, pool tables, combination pool and billiard tables, pigeon-hole tables, shooting galleries and bowling alleys:

Section 2. That section one be amended to read: Sec. 1. The following fees are required to be paid for a license to keep for public use or hire, within the city limits, the articles herein named to wit: Billiard tables, each \$5.00; Pool tables, each \$5.00; Combination pool and billiard tables, each \$5.00; Pigeon hole tables, each \$5.00; Shooting galleries, each \$10.00; Bowling alleys, each \$10.00.

Section 3. Section 2 is hereby amended by striking out after the word "Installments" the following words: "One on the first day of May and one on the first day of November of each and every year" Section 2 to read no person shall keep for public use or hire any of the articles mentioned in the preceding section or pursue the avocation or business therein mentioned, without first having obtained a license therefor, which license may be paid in two equal installments being for the period of six months, and shall be paid to the City Recorder for the use of the general fund of the city, who shall issue a receipt therefor setting forth the special object and time for which it is issued:

Section 4. Owing to the indefinite language of Ordinance 43, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect after its publication or posting as required as required by law. Passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor of the city of Toledo, Oregon, this 7th day of October 1907.
