That shipment of \$7,100,000 which arrived in New York Tuesday and \$21,000,000 soon to arrive should help the situation some.

The following piece of advice was sent out by the secretary of the Oregon Press Association: "Wood Choppers Wanted—If you don't believe your space is worth enough to give you a decent living and something besides, 'take to the woods.' If you don't ask the price you will not get it."

Governor Chamberlain has appointed delegates to the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress to be held at Muskogee, Oklahoma, November 19-22. Hon. Arthur F. Francis, Secretary of the Congress, requests every commercial organization in Oregon to name delegates and report to him immediately at Muskogee.

The first frost of the season occurred last Friday night, although very light, it damaged the strawberries and other berries that don't want to quit ripening. Yet we should not kick very hard at a little frost at this season of the year. Think of being back in the Eastern states where they have been getting hard frosts for several weeks.

The fires in town the first of the week proved the value of our little fire department. Through their leadership two serious fires were averted. While a few members of the company slept during the fire of Sunday night enough heard and responded to the alarm to lead in getting the hose cart out, laying and coupling hose, turning on the water, etc. Without their leadership at a fire there would be delays and delays are disastrous at such times. No, the boys are not in the company simply to escape road tax. They rightly believe they are a public benefit.

Checks "payable only through clearing house" get the money just the same as the old fashioned kind for all necessary purposes. This little hesitation in the stream of financial wealth, when Oregon is producing for the good year 1907 a lumber product of \$30,000,000, live stock and wool worth \$20,000,000, poultry and eggs worth \$3,000,000, a grain crop worth \$15,000,000, and a fruit crop of \$5,000,000, and erecting buildings worth \$20,000,000, seems just a little queer, and things will right themselves. Oregon banks have plenty of money, our people are out of debt, our mortgages are paid, and a little cool judgment and optimism will bring us out all right.

The authority for proclaiming holidays in Oregon is found in Section 3918 of Bellinger and Cotton's Code, Vol. 2, page 1823 which reads: "The following days shall be and are hereby declared to be legal holidays in this state, to wit: Every Sunday, the first day of January, the twenty-second day of February, the thirtieth day of May, the Fourth day of July, the first Monday in September, the 25 day of December, and every day on which an election is held throughout the state, and every day appointed by the President of the United States or by the Governor of this state as a day of public fasting, thanksgiving or holiday. Whenever any legal holiday other than a Sunday falls upon Sunday, the Monday following shall be observed as such holiday. Negotiable instruments falling due on

any legal holiday shall be due and payable on the next succeeding business day."
